Hosting a major event always leads you to wonder if it will be worth it. Will all the hours spent in preparation and execution produce anything worthwhile and lasting? It's a fair question and one we need to think and pray about.

As I shared with you in January's *Bell Tower*, we at VCC are hosting the Global Leadership Summit on August 9-10. It is a huge undertaking and one that will require a lot of hard work from a lot of people. So, naturally, we need to understand why we are doing this. While there are many good reasons for this commitment, I want to share with you the one that I think is most crucial.

One of, if not the most important, responsibility a church must embrace to fulfill its mission is to develop leaders. Way back in 1984, Ginger and I packed up our ten-monthold son Christopher and headed to Vienna to join a team of people committed to assisting churches in Eastern Europe with their most acutely felt need: leadership development. It had been the strategy of the communist governments to control and reduce the impact of churches by limiting or outright eliminating the development of leaders. Hamper, control, or remove leaders and you could control or destroy the movement. In that environment the importance of leadership that was trained and encouraged became evident to me.

Now fast forward to the present. Here we are at VCC in 2012 and we are asking ourselves how well we are preparing our church, not just to survive, but to thrive well into the future. On the foundation of what God has done are we ready to move boldly into what God has for us ahead? Are we truly becoming a Christ-centered community where lives are being transformed? Are people being cared for and helped in their walks with Christ?

Are we individually and as a church growing more and more into the image of Christ? Are we preparing the next generations of leaders?

These are important questions that we must answer and we are committed to doing all we can to live up to this calling. We want everyone who is a part of VCC to be fully yielded to the Lordship of Christ and to live a life of blessing and impact for God's Kingdom. In order to do this we must be getting better and better as leaders now and we must be raising up and preparing new leaders.

The Global Leadership Summit is a powerful tool in this process. While our staff and some of our elders have already benefitted from previous Summits I want more of you to experience this wonderful environment for growth. For those already in leadership roles this can only help you be better. For those who might respond that you are not in a specific leadership role I would say that at its most foundational aspect, leadership is influence. If that is so, then all of us are leaders. All of us influence people everyday in our families, jobs, schools, and neighborhoods. And maybe some day God will call you into a specific leadership role. The Summit can give you excellent tools to help you be better prepared to have an impact for Christ.

I am truly excited for us to host the Summit. While realizing the potential for our own church's growth we also get the opportunity to bless the whole East Bay by being hosts. Let's pray and work together to make this a truly memorable event, launching us forward in God's plan for us.

A short-term trip to Guatemala is also being planned.




Giving Back What God Has Given

CrossPoint by Don Elser

You turn on the TV. A movie is in progress. Everyone seems elated. A couple has gotten together—after what seems like some confusion, an evil empire has been conquered and a child is returned safely in dirty battered clothing to her crying mother. The credits roll.

You have this vague feeling that this might be a pretty great motion picture, but you've got absolutely no context. It's a great ending with no sense of story. No tension. No drama. Some confusion.

At times Easter can be like this—especially for people newer to the faith. Even if we're familiar with the story, it can be odd to hit the end of the week with balloons and lilies and fanfare and a bold "He is RISEN!!" without any time to "experience" events that led up to the credits rolling on Easter Sunday.

Because of this, we will be hosting a special evening event on April 1, called CrossPoint. It will be on Palm/Passion Sunday...we'll move from the Triumphal Entry of Jesus into Jerusalem that morning, to a Cross focus that evening.

CrossPoint is a time of quiet candlelit reflection on the sacrifice of Jesus and the final phrases he uttered as He was being crucified for the sins of humanity. It involves a limited amount of congregational participation and welcome at the beginning, video support, and then moves toward a time of dramatic readings and simple music which leads us through all of the "last words of Christ." It will end in complete darkness—except for a light on a rugged Cross—and allow participants to stay and pray for as long as they'd like, or to leave quietly. Most people who have attended a service like this find it moving and appreciate the time and space to reflect on the sacrifice of Jesus in preparation for the celebration coming on the following Sunday.

iNVERSION will be finishing their evening by participating in this service. They are welcoming those who wouldn't normally attend iNVERSION to come early at 6:00pm for the teaching leading up to this worship experience at 7:30pm. People are welcome to participate in either part of the evening—or both—as they sense God leading them.

Hope you are able to be part of this experience of "being with Jesus" at the Cross!

All Summer Long!

One of our most popular high school summer activities is the annual mission trip to Ensenada, Mexico. This trip impacts our students in many ways. For those who are traveling to Mexico for the first time, there is culture shock along with the excitement of traveling outside of the United States for maybe the first time. For those who have been before there is the excitement of getting reacquainted with friends they have made the year before and an anticipation of seeing if the work they did the previous year has withstood weather and life.

This trip impacts students in a big way. Our students work hard. Mornings are spent on construction. They may be starting a new home or adding a second room onto one that was begun the previous summer. They help with repairs on and around the church. Some groups are assigned to prepare meals and carry water to the workers. In the late afternoon they get cleaned up and break into groups that go out to different locations where they hold Vacation Bible Schools for the local children. They lead worship and share the Gospel through Bible stories. Like our own VBS, they have a craft activity that they prepare before their departure and have the children complete during their VBS time. They return with a new respect for what it means to be Christian and to live a Christian life.

Not only did VCC and Shining Light families come but we also had truly needy families from the community. They were so grateful and thanked everyone profusely with tears in their eyes.

At the end we still had tons of clothes left over...truly a loaves and fishes story. We connected with Horizon High School a continuing education school for pregnant and teen mothers here in Pleasanton and gave them all the leftover baby clothes. All the remaining clothing was divided up between a foster care facility in Palo Alto and the Richmond Rescue Mission. We also found out through our contacts about a group of people that live and work at the fairgrounds. Our Women's Bible Studies were able to use that contact and make holiday gift baskets for those families.

Talk about a bounty! From a small idea to share our clothing to being able to really reach out and bless the community has truly been a blessing for all.

We are looking forward with anticipation to our second Sharing Closet on April 25 and 26 in the Kidz Connection Portable from 9:00AM-2:00PM each day. We are accepting children's sizes newborn through size 14 as well as children's books to exchange. So clean out those closets and mark your calendars.
