Role Reversals Luke 16:19-31 Message-based Small Group Lesson

Overview

This is perhaps one of the more disturbing parables of Jesus as it paints a raw picture of the journey of two men in this life and the next. Wealth is again the topic of Jesus, but primarily as the rich man's perspective on wealth reveals his hardness of heart towards God and those around him. In the end, focusing and relying on ourselves leads us down a darkened path, while selfless investment in others will always give much more than it takes.

- 6. What are the next life consequences of their earthly behavior?
- 7. Does their behavior in the afterlife reflect/show any changes in their attitude?
