Building the bug is only one part of what needs to happen, and we have a whole list of other things that need to happen:

I) Keep up to par on parts list and budget

We are going to need about \$10,000.00 to get the basic build done. This does not include a Race Engine and Transmission, or labor to paint it.

2) Promotional needs

We are going to look at a line of promotional goods that can be sold to help raise funds for the build. Eventually after the car is done and rolling we will continue to sell water bottles, coffee cups and T-shirts to help La Casa De Esperanza

3) Sponsorships

We will be working on a Sponsorship package to send to business and churches, yes, just like in the real racing world. 4) Speaking Engagements
