Moving Forward in Our Calling

The start of any new year is the season for making resolutions, fresh starts, and recommitting to the things that are important to us. As we head into 2013 there are some areas that we want to concentrate on to continue to move forward in our calling to see God transform lives in a Christ-centered community.

This past fall we did two things to help us in our commitment to get better at fulfilling our vision. First, we took a fresh look at what the Gospel is. We saw first and foremost the Gospel is the story of Jesus and his righteous reign as our King and Lord. That this King died for us to open the way into his kingdom is a staggering and incomparable display of sacrificial love. Having opened the way into his Kingdom, he invites us to receive forgiveness and become his disciples, forming us into his image and calling us to radically trust him as we participate in his Kingdom work.

Second, we asked you to participate in a Spiritual Life Survey to help us gauge and evaluate how we are doing in our journey to grow in our relationship with Jesus. We had a remarkably high participation rate and we have now received the results of the survey. While we are still sifting through the mountain of data and determining the best ways to use what we have learned, there are a couple of findings from the survey that I want to share with you.

The data is processed in a way that identifies the congregation's top priorities. The top two are that you want help from our church in "understanding the Bible in depth" and help in "developing a personal relationship with Christ."

Both of these match up with what we already are committed to and where we are focusing our attention as we plan for this next season of ministry.

The designers of the survey have also developed some descriptive categories based on the data they have gathered from the 1000+ churches that have completed this survey. Our results place us in the category labeled "introverted." This means that our results indicate that we are a relatively mature church, where we are regularly engaging with Scripture and have a strong acceptance of core Christian beliefs. In their description, for churches like ours "this strong inner commitment to faith does not typically carry over into outward-focused activities like serving those in need or sharing Christianity with non-believers."

These results are challenging, but also encouraging as they align well with the way God has been leading us. In our Sunday morning services on January 13 I will be sharing more details from the survey and explaining some of the challenges this brings to us as individual followers of Jesus and for us as a church as well.

Let's be praying that God will use all of this to draw us closer to himself and direct us to the kind of Kingdom impact he is calling us into.


Fit or Couch Potato Brain?

Your brain consists of two types of matter. One is a thin layer of cells that are important to learning and memory known as 'gray matter.' Throughout the weekend retreat we learn that this Someone loves them and made them just as they are, even without a 4.0 GPA or a home run swing.

This is the best camp ever!”, as he belted out *Take Me Out to the Ball Game* AND line-danced in the Portable with his team.



It was on a Wild at Heart Retreat (there’s that word again) in 2005 that God sparked a fire to get STRETCH off the ground. Each year since, STRETCH (Striving to Reach Excellence through Christ’s Hand) has been sharing the love of God with young athletes, many who do not have a church home.

VCC Pastor Danny Hall has shared his love of sports and God at the coach and instructor luncheon on Saturday before we send them back out into the field for an afternoon of intense skills training and development. Once again this year we are super blessed to have VCC Youth Pastors Ryan and Giuseppe training and mentoring our team leads as they prepare them to share God’s love and acceptance with the campers throughout the weekend.

Setting Us Free Brings Blessings Near and Far

Our 2011 Setting Us Free capital campaign is continuing to bear fruit. Some of our congregation may not have been around then, so a little history is in order. Our main financial goal was to eliminate the debt that the church was carrying for the parking structure. One of the most common initial responses we heard was “Why do we have a parking structure?” Serious concerns about parking emerged during and after the last major construction project at VCC, the building of the sanctuary. Ultimately a unique partnership with PUSD solved our parking problems by building a parking structure adjacent to VCC that could be utilized by the church and Amador Valley High School. In effect, the joint venture with PUSD was equivalent to doubling the size of the church campus. In addition to solving our long-term parking needs, it would also enable us to more fully develop our existing 3-acre site.

On November 6, 2011 Commitment Sunday, you pledged \$2.3 million over the next three years which will result in the payoff of the parking structure debt and a tithe of \$230,000 to missions. To date the parking structure loan has been paid down \$1,067,996 and \$118,375 has gone towards special missions projects. Since our last update the projects below have been funded:

Harvest Mission – five bicycles for missionaries to use to travel to distant villages and funding of a one-year program providing free education for children not currently attending school.

Rafiki – 20 small network computers and e-library set up for one Rafiki village in Nigeria; benefiting orphaned and under-privileged children.

Hope for the Nations – the newly created Empowerment Center is used for free after-school English and computer classes to provide job skills in this predominately Muslim area.

David Eckman/Aphesis – this translation of the Aphesis material into Chinese will greatly extend the reach of this ministry that has been life-changing for many in our congregation.

South American Mission/Bolivia – provided resources (flannel graph, lesson books, games, craft patterns, and more) for a children’s library and enabled the children’s ministry team to attend two conferences.

California School Project – 45 high school mentors were trained to reach their individual schools in the Los Angeles area.

CRU – Campus Crusade missionaries, Adam Nixon and Andrew Burger, received assistance with the cost of their seminary classes allowing them to increase their ability to lead Bible studies, provide discipleship and evangelism.

The Baby that Almost Wasn't Born

Hello my name is Nina, and I am one of the many women who came to Valley Pregnancy Center in a desperate time of need. This time last year I was laid off, discovered I was pregnant, and my companion Jesse and I received a thirty-day eviction notice all in one week. Instead of the joy every newly-expecting mother should experience, I was overcome with fear and uncertainty. I fled to an abortion clinic as I'm sure many young women who are unexpectedly expecting do.

There I knew with absolute certainty I had a new life inside my body. I was given abundant information on abortion procedures, no personal attention, and not once asked how I felt, or even if I was OK. My visit was short, cold, and it seemed I only had one option, so my immediate and first choice was to have an abortion.

A few days later I began experiencing horrible pain and my sister's friend, who went to Valley Pregnancy Center, spoke highly of her experience there, so I went in. For the first time since I discovered I was pregnant I felt someone other than my immediate family genuinely cared about us. The nurse manager had answers to my questions, remedies for my pain, and concern that made me feel important. Days later when my pain had subsided I received a phone call from Jill. She called to check on my health and over-all well-being. I remember hanging up the phone that day and feeling a big smile on my face, someone truly cared.

I made an appointment at Valley Pregnancy Center where Jesse and I were greeted with warm smiles and friendship from the moment we walked in the door. We were congratulated for the first time and given the opportunity to see the life we had made growing inside me through an ultra sound. When we returned again we met Pauline,



our counselor, who greeted us with comfort and support. I found it amazing how much guidance and love she extended to us, complete strangers. She gave us the attention and open ear we needed.

Something far greater and more powerful than me was trying to tell us it was a mistake to have an abortion. Instead Jesse and I continued to visit Valley Pregnancy Center on a regular basis. We attended the prenatal classes they offer, and the medical pre-natal care. We learned so much about our growing baby, and how to be successful parents. We came to find comfort in meeting with Pauline every two weeks through the majority of my pregnancy. She quickly became more than a counselor and more than a mentor, she became a dear friend.

All of the remarkable women and men at Valley Pregnancy Center are extraordinary and giving people. The love and support they offer through their volunteer time, is just as important as the information they give with an open and un-biased view. When I look at my beautiful baby girl I know without Valley Pregnancy Center we would have made a terrible mistake that we would regret for the rest of our lives. I appreciate and will always cherish my experience at Valley Pregnancy Center, because they gave me the opportunity to find the purpose and joy of my life... my beautiful baby girl, Charlotte Rose.

Spark Groups (Multiply)


