Overview

While we are called to proclaim the Good News of the Kingdom, this proclamation is most powerful when people can see it being lived out day by day by God's people. The core ethic of this Kingdom life is love. In fact a radical commitment to live out Kingdom life serves our proclamation in two significant ways. First it demonstrates to the world a different way to live than for oneself, showing what a true transformational community looks like. The community of love stands as a *warning* and a *witness*. It is a warning of how destructive life without God is and it is a witness to how fulfilling and life-changing it can be. Second, living in a community based on sacrificial love strengthens us to be better at facing the challenge that comes from being proclaimers of a message that challenges the ways of this world. If we were really advancing the kingdom, then the reality of true community would be seen by us as far more essential than it is now. The two go hand in hand.

A glance through the NT descriptions of a life of mutual loving commitment gives us an insight into the challenge and possibility of achieving this goal. While there are many ways we could study this, looking at all the "one another" commands of the NT letters will serve as a good guide. When put side by side these commands describe the kind of life that would truly move us toward our goal of seeing lives transformed in a Christ-centered community.
